We began our first US Sailing Certified Keelboat programming and saw the addition of a Tartan 4000 into our fleet. The Katie our dedicated adaptive sailing Sonar's refit was completed and she looks like a brand new boat. Our numbers continued to increase as you will see in the report to follow and registration as of mid-February is looking like another year of growth is before us for the 2018 season.

Our relationship with Sheboygan South High School was a great success in the fall of 2017. A total of 57 Senior Gym students took part in 9 days of basic sall training. The success of this program has led to the formation of a credit course at South High that will begin this April and will incorporate STEAM education as well as a more thorough keelboat training curriculum for 8 students. This exposure to salling will remain with them for the rest of their lives.

Adaptive salling with SEAS has grown steadily since its incorporation. The completion of the Katle was a major step forward as well as the redesign of the blind

saling sound marks. The relationships built with local groups, such as RCS, have also paid dividends.
